

On December 8th, Keota received a nice visit from Democratic Candidate, Mr. Martin O'Malley. He gave a presentation of his view on the economy. He states, "economy is not money, it is people." He used members of the audience to show how the economy has changed in 30 years. Participators were Cole Brenneman, Avery Conrad, Caroline Reeves, Alex Johnson, Jaden Lawson, and a Junior girl from $\label{lem:content} \textit{Centerville}. \ \textit{He gave statistics and placed}$ the students to show the change. A lot of students said they enjoyed the presentation O'Malley gave, because it helped them better understand the economy. The Keota Jr. Sr. High School student body is really grateful for Mr. O'Malley's willingness to come down and talk to them.

After the presentation, O'Malley answered a few questions from the audience. One question was, "What are your views on the current Syrian Crisis?" He answered that we need a diplomatic solution, and he feels we need to build up our country. He states that refugees are victims, not our enemies. O'Malley is known as the first presidential candidate to say the United States should welcome 65,000 Syrian refugees in the next year. He believes keeping America safe and providing refuge for those fleeing destruction and death is not a zero-sum choice. He also feels America needs to work together with nations that have a common interest to destroy ISIS.

O'Malley has served as the Governor of Maryland from 2007 to 2015. He served as the chair of the Governor's Executive Council from 2007 to 2015 and served as the co-chair of the Council of Governors from 2013 to 2015. From 1999 to 2007, O'Malley was the Mayor of Baltimore.




