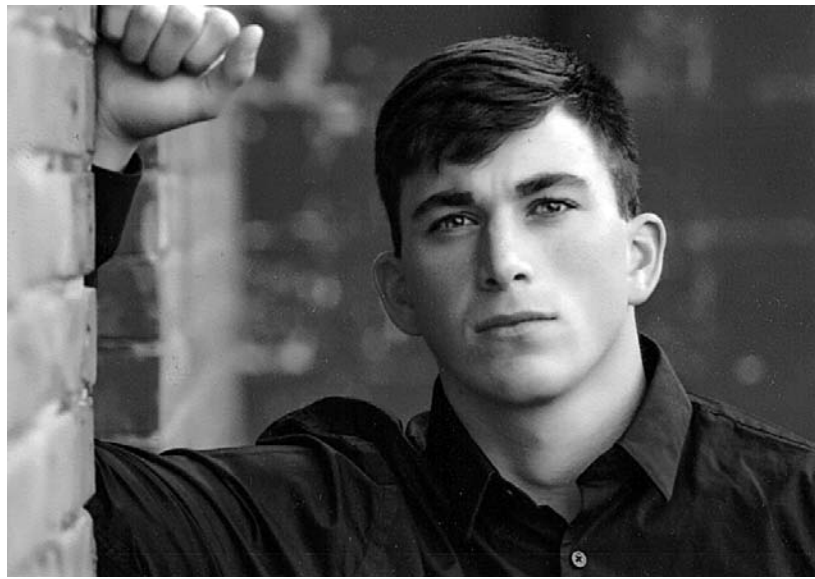

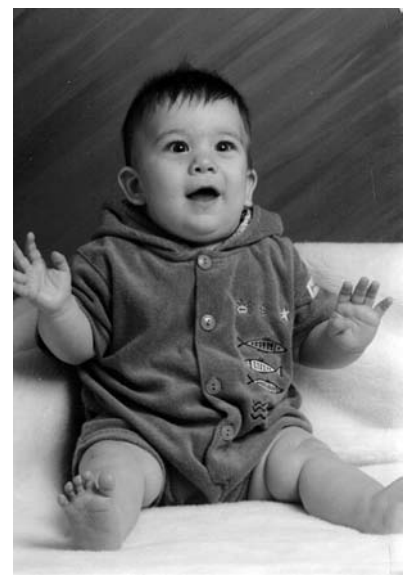
"Government has prepared me the most for life, because I learned a lot about our country," he said.

The Keota Track Team went to Washington on March 24. In the 100 meter dash, Luke Greiner ran a 12.59 and June Welt Daing ran a 14.99. In the 200 meter dash, Isaiah Hahn ran a 26.66, June Welt Daing ran a 28.59, and Branden Hyman ran a 29.53.

In the 400 meter dash, Zach Mousel ran a 56.71, Isaiah Hahn ran a 1:00.43, and Dylan Burgdorf ran a 1:05.47.

In the 800 meter run, Logan Sieren ran a 2:27.55.

In the 1600 meter run, Turner Klein ran a 5:13.59. In the 3200 meter run, Turner Klein ran a 10:35.37.

In the long jump, Luke Greiner jumped 17-08.50 and Zach Mousel jumped 16-11.50.

In the shot put, Alex Heisdorffer threw 34-07.00, Ben Shemanski threw 29-07.00, and Trey Carlson threw 28-07.75. In the discus, Ben Shemanski threw 76-00.00, Alex Heisdorffer threw 74-11.00, and Cole Breneman threw 72-07.00.

The 4x100 meter relay team ran a 51.18. The 4x200 meter relay team ran a 1:57.50. The 4x800 meter relay team ran a 10:30.23. The 1600 Medley Relay team ran a 4:15.46.

Next up for the boys is the Pekin Invitational on Thurs., April 7.
