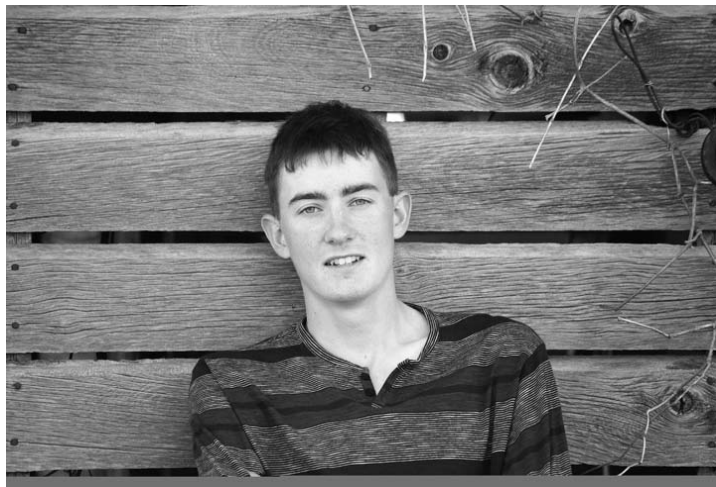


Pictured above from left to right are SICL Honor Choir attendees Anna Duwa, Ana Ackerman, Jaydin Boer, and Taylor Conrad.

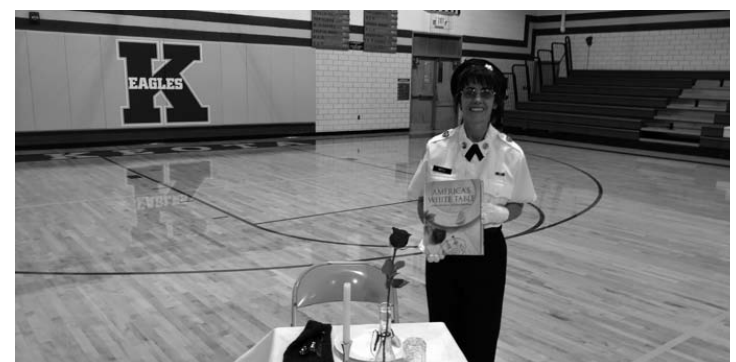
ble is to be used on Veteran's Day, and is set to honor those soldiers who have given their life for our freedom.
