## BOYS BASKETBALL AWARDS

Recently the Keota Boys Basketball team had their annual team banquet. Many awards, as well as several new records, were achieved this season by players on the team. Who got what this year was hard to decide because everyone on the team contributed so much this year. Everyone was a crucial part of the team. In the end though, Hunter Wilson (junior) and Avery Conrad (senior) received the Honorable Mention All-Conference award for the SICL Conference. Cole Stout (senior) received the SICL Second Team All-Conference award, and Jacob Wickenkamp (senior) received the award of First Team All-Conference for the SICL. Alongside this award, Jacob Wickenkamp and Cole Stout also broke a couple of records.
