GOLF SEASON IN FULL SWING

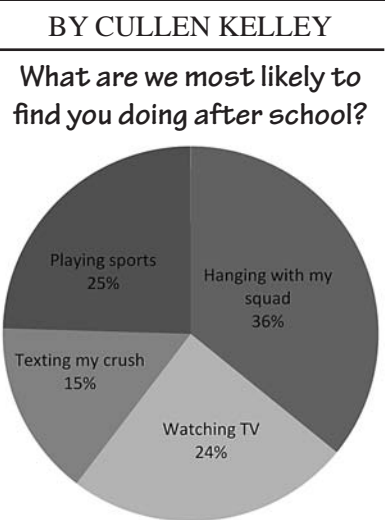

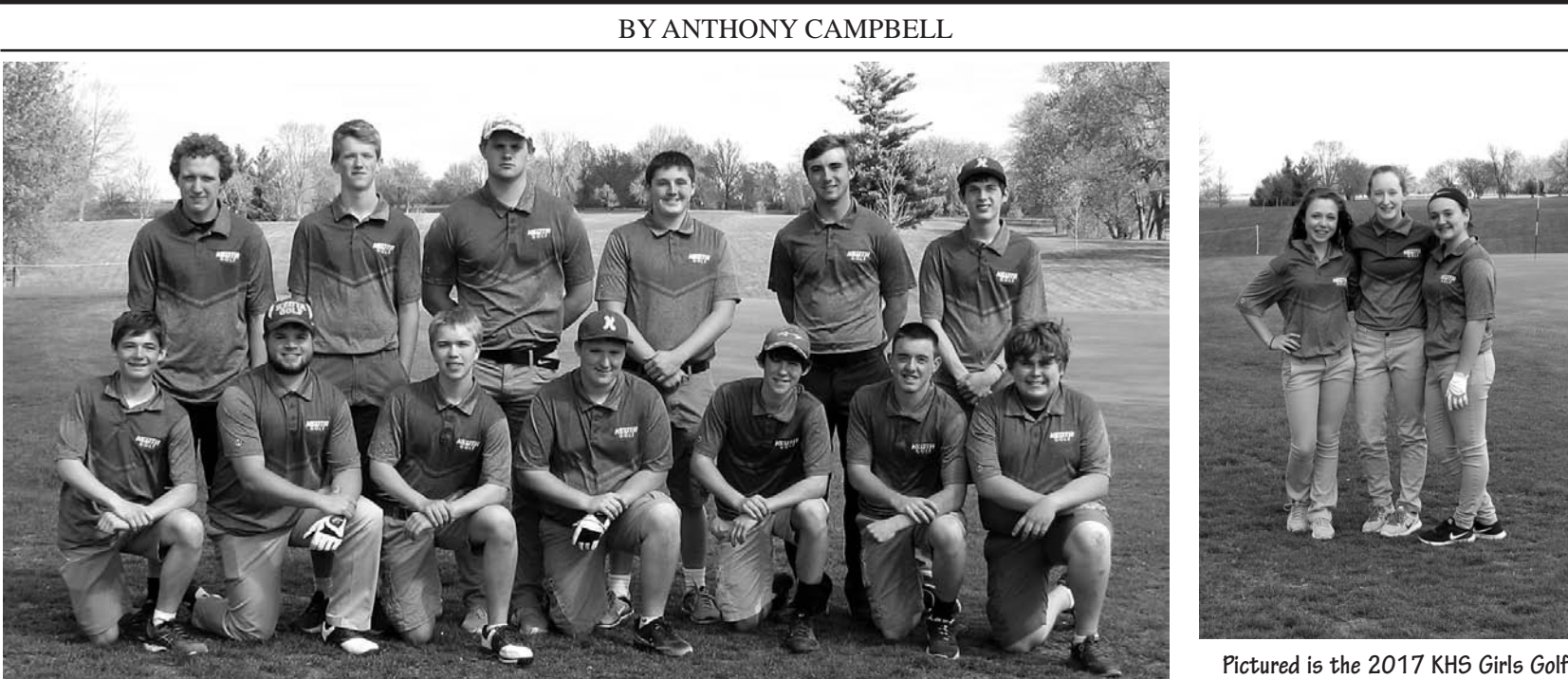
