Roles have been cast and practice has begun for the Keota High School spring play.

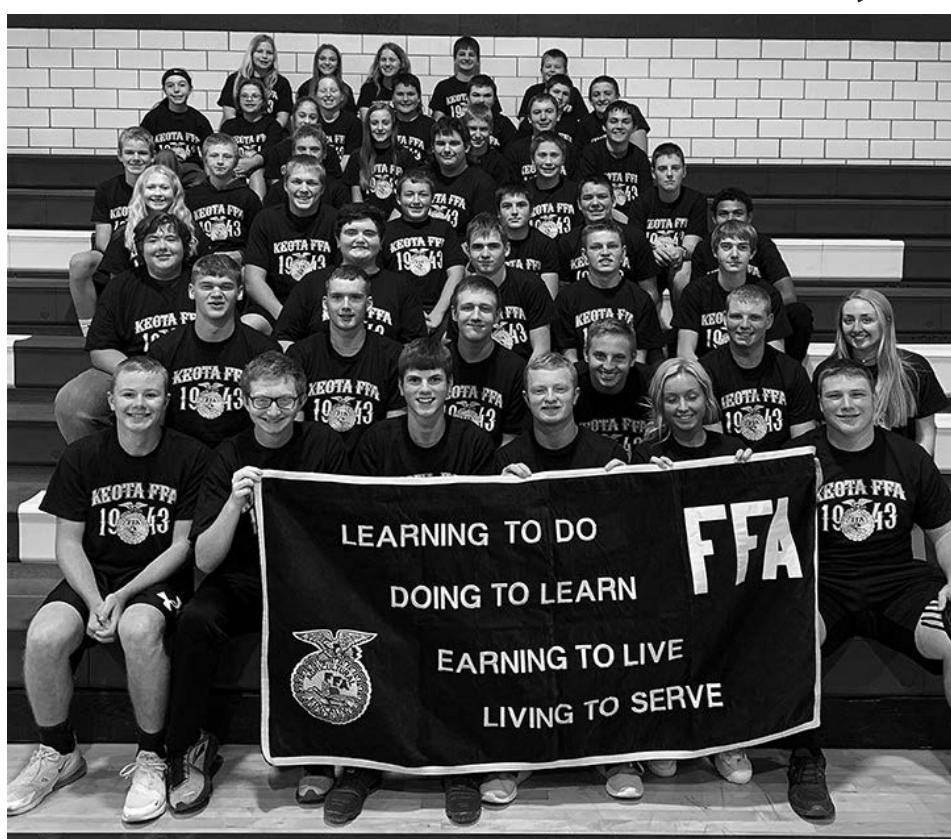

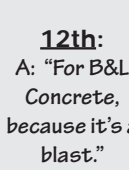

## Keota Girls Basketball Season Wraps Up

The 2020-21 Keota girls basketball season came to an end last Thursday, on February 12. The Lady Eagles ended their season against a familiar foe, the Tigers of Iowa Valley. There were two previous matchups between these two squads, with Iowa Valley able to edge out wins in all three contests.

The team ended with a 2-15 record, and they showed improvement throughout the season. Junior Taylor Kindred led the squad in scoring and rebounding, followed closely by senior Sky Weber. Sophomore Nicole Clarahan ended first in steals and assists, while guards Macie McDonald and Bailey Sieren were also factors on the offensive and defensive ends. Sophomore Taylor Garman was able to knock down some shots for the squad as well, while the freshman pair of Madison Scott and Emily Sheetz were also able to get in some qual-

and shooting 11% better as a team from the freethrow line.
