TRACK SEASON PREVIEW

The Keota Track Team has begun practicing and is looking forward to having a successful season after missing the 2020 season due to Covid-19.

The Keota girls team is made up of Taylor Garman and Nicole Clarahan, a small but mighty squad. Members of this year's boys team include Brady Duwa, Sam Sieren, Wyatt Sieren, Brandon Greiner, Kota Hammen, Noah Fisher, and Ashton Thomas. This year's team has lots of goals to accomplish, and they hope to make an appearance at the blue oval in Des Moines at State

The girls' first meet is Tuesday, March 30 at Belle Plaine, while the boys open their season Thursday, April 1 at Belle Plaine. The District meet will be held Thursday, May 13, location TBA. The Iowa High School State Track Meet will be held from May 20-22 at Drake University. At this time, track meets are expected to run as normal, with social distancing guidelines maintained as much as possible.

Information about the 2021 Drake Relays has been released and can be accessed online at godrakebulldogs.com. The meet is scheduled for Thursday, April 22 from 9 a.m. to about 5 p.m., with all events being held on the same day.

Typically, Drake Relays is a three day event for the best runners in each class to run against each other. Also new this year, each race will be run as a final, except for the 4x100 meter relay, which will have preliminary runs and be reduced to 48 teams. Field events (long jump, high jump, discuss, shot put) will have their own preliminaries and finals.

Guidelines regarding fans and spectators will be determined at a later date. You can see the Blue Standard in the table below, which guarantees athletes a spot if their best time meets the mark listed.
