The students of the Ag Construction class are building a gazebo for their class project this year. This is being built for one of the student's relatives.

The class came together and formed a plan for how they would approach the big project. Mr. Jamison, the instructor, bought the materials needed and the class sorted and organized all of the materials to make it easier for them to find and start the assembling and sawing processes. Splitting

into groups of three or four. the students broke apart to complete assembling, sawing, and separation/ measuring tasks. Once the sawing was complete and the measurements were accurate and ready, the groups came together to start creating a structurally sound foundation for the future gazebo by installing several planks along the inside of the current wooden square.

They finished the foundation by adding spiral-style wooden plank flooring and attaching the floorboards



students are working on, which is installing the railing of the gazebo.

where the grain of each floorboard was perpendicular to the next. The students then started to attach seven support beams to the edges and corners of the gazebo, while also attaching connecting beams across the tops of the future gazebo for better support for the roof that will later be

attached to the gazebo. Finally, the students of the Ag Construction class are working on installing the railing for the gazebo, as seen above in the picture on the right. The construction class is working hard to make their fellow community member happy and create a beautiful woodworking piece. Mr. Jamison is the ag
