As a little girl, Chloe has always wanted to be a vet because

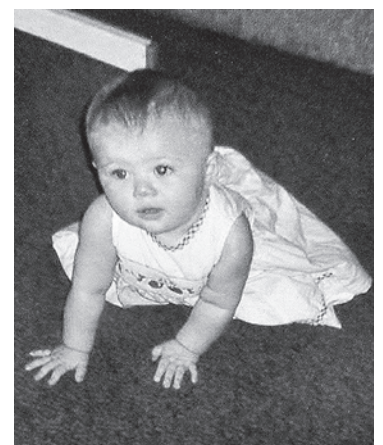
