## 10 Facts about Senior Chloe Pringle

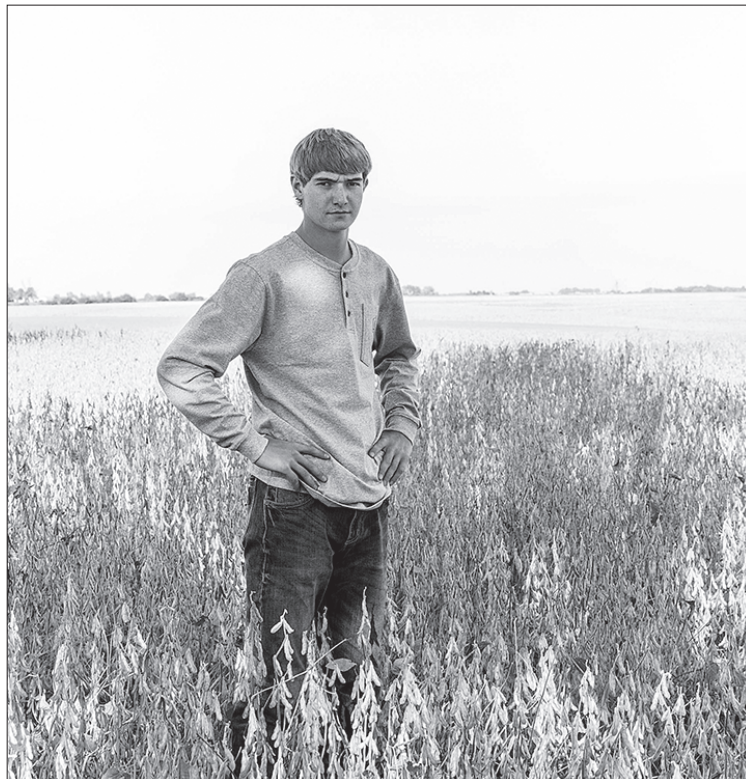
