Keota Basketball All Conference selections

The Keota Eagle boys had an extremely good season with a record of 21-4, which was reflected in their post season honors. The Keota Boys had four players who received All Conference honors in the South Iowa Cedar league.

Honorable mention awards went to sophomore small forward Billie Kindred and junior center Evan Vittetoe. Billie averaged 7 points, 8 rebounds, and 3 assists per contest, whilst the big man Evan Vittetoe averaged nearly 12 points, 8 rebounds, and 2 blocked shots per game.

Junior point guard Cole Kindred was on the Second Team All Conference. Cole was an all around threat this season on both offense and defense, averaging 12 points, 4 rebounds, 5 assists, and 2 steals a game.

Junior shooting guard Sawyer Stout was a Unanimous Selection for the First Team All Conference. Sawyer finished the season

averaging just above 18 points a game, scoring double digits in every contest this season.

The Lady Eagles finished the season with a record of 7-15. The Lady Eagles received three All Conference honors for their efforts.

Two girls received honorable mention awards. Senior Nicole Clarahan was one of the two; Nicole averaged 6 points a game, 5 boards, and 2 steals. Senior Macie McDonald also received this award; Macie averaged 10 points per game at 28%. Macie's standout game this season is when she made 6 three-pointers against Hillcrest Academy.

The lone Second Team All Conference selection for the Lady Eagles was Sophomore Kimi Clarahan. Kimi averaged 9 points per game on 31% shooting, 5 rebounds, 2.5 assists, and 2.5 steals.

Both the Keota Eagles boys and girls teams had incredible seasons. Congratulations to these standout players.
