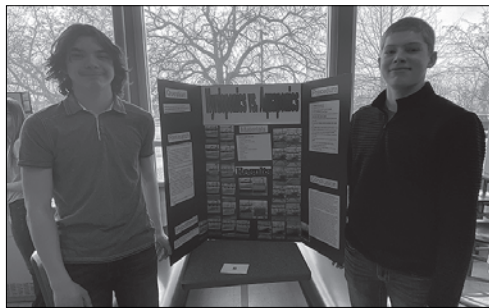
The next category was Best Presentation. The group that

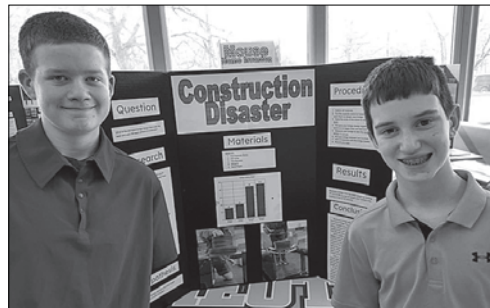
The overall winners of the science fair were as follows. In third place was Maya Dalton and Jaylah Redlinger, who present-

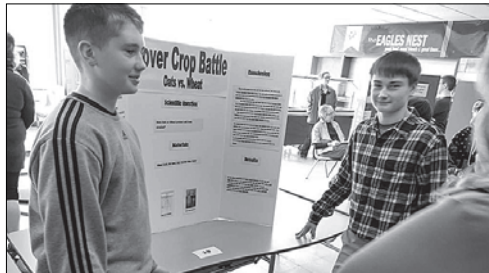

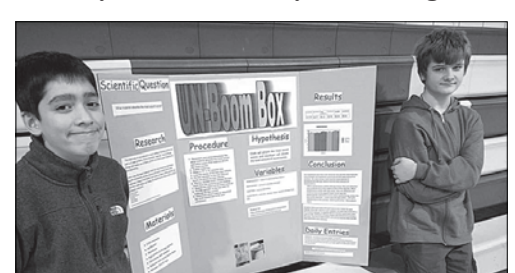
